

## Krakow-Katowice, Host Cities of the XII UNESCO Creative Cities Network Annual Meeting in 2018

Following an online vote launched in late September, Krakow and Katowice, respectively Creative Cities of Literature and Music from Poland, and also jointly referred to as Krakowice, have been selected by the members to host the XII UCCN Annual Meeting in June 2018.

The XII Annual Meeting in Krakowice will be themed "Creative Crosscroads", building on the idea of cross-sectoral cooperation between Creative Cities. This major Network's gathering will provide an excellent opportunity for all members to showcase, share and discuss the outcomes of joint-initiatives, as well as to identify concrete projects, policies and programmes putting culture and creativity at the core of sustainable urban development, in other words, concrete examples of the local and international implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, notably its city-related Goal 11 on making "cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable".

"Our vision is to build a programme and provide an experience that is reflective of our strengths: our role as a connector and our role as a mine for vast creative resources. This didactic work reflects our strong belief that together we will achieve more as a macro-regional creative cooperative.
